

Windows 7 has an updated program for displaying your computer through the projector after you have hooked your laptop into the smart desk. The steps below explain the process.

Accessing the “Connect to Projector” Window

1. Connect your laptop to the smart desk and, if you haven’t already, turn it on.
2. Press the “Fn” + “F7” keys to bring up the following window (see Fig. 1).

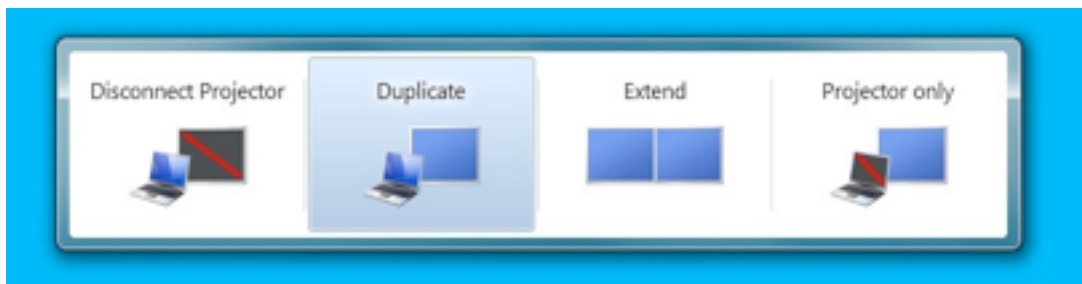

Then, select the appropriate option for how you want to display your information:

- *Disconnect Projector* (computer only): Makes your laptop screen not display through the projector.
- *Duplicate*: The same thing displays on both your laptop screen and through the projector.
- *Extend*: Makes the projector display an extension of your laptop screen; you can have several files or browser windows visible on your laptop screen and then drag the desired document/window onto the projector screen.
- *Projector only*: The display will only be visible through the projector.

To Change Screen Resolution

1. Right-click on the desktop and select “Screen Resolution.”

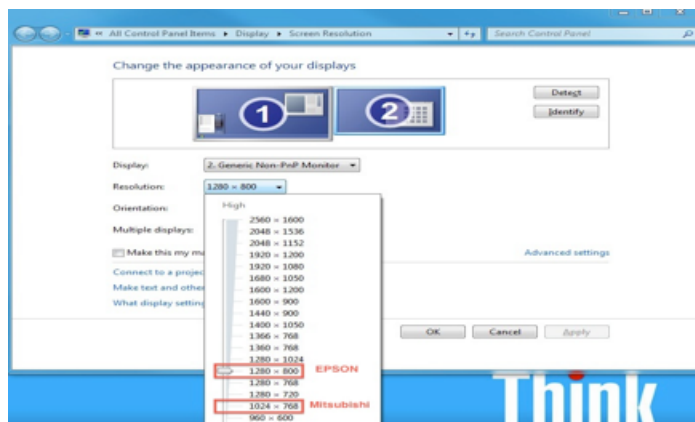

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2. If you are connecting to a widescreen projector, choose “1280 x 800”; for a standard projector, select “1024 x 768.” *Remember, the smart desk is labeled with the type of projector used in the room.*

Troubleshooting

Can't See the Display on both Laptop and Projector Screens

If you are unable to see the display on both the laptop and projector screens, press the “Fn” + “F7” keys again to bring up the “Connect to Projector” screen. If this doesn't work, restart your computer and go through the steps again.
